

R8 Nagahara Gakuen Scholarship Application Guidelines for Privately Financed International Students

1. Types of Scholarships

(1) MEXT Honors Scholarship for Privately Financed International Students

[Eligible Applicants] Junior College international students of Nishikyushu University

[Quota] A few

[Amount] 576,000 yen (12 months) / 288,000 yen (6 months)

<Reference for FY2025>

12-month recipients: 2 students

6-month recipients: 3 students

(2) Saga Prefecture Subsidy for Nagahara Gakuen International Student Scholarship

[Eligible Applicants] International students of Nishikyushu University and Junior College

[Quota] Adjusted according to Saga Prefecture's annual budget

[Amount] Adjusted according to Saga Prefecture's annual budget

<Reference for FY2025>

University: 120,000 yen per year (3 students)

Junior College: 200,000–350,000 yen per year (7 students)

(Note) Scholarship amounts may change depending on the organizers' budget.

2. Eligibility Requirements

You must meet all of the following conditions (1)–(6).

(1) Must be an enrolled regular international student at the university (excluding graduate school) or junior college.

(2) Must have a GPA of 2.70 or higher from the previous year (calculated using the JASSO method).

(3) Students receiving or planning to receive scholarships from other institutions may not receive this scholarship.

(4) Applicants for the scholarship listed in section (2) above must have a strong intention to work or start a business in Saga Prefecture after graduation.

(5) Must have part-time work activities that comply with immigration laws and university rules.

*Students who have worked beyond permitted hours will receive a deduction during selection.

(6) Must have Japanese proficiency at approximately N2 level.

3. Termination and Repayment of Scholarships

Scholarship benefits may be terminated and repayment of disbursed funds required if any of the following apply:

(1) False information is found in the application documents.

- (2) The student receives disciplinary action, is unlikely to complete studies (including leave of absence or repeating), or similar.
- (3) The student is deemed unsuitable based on academic performance or conduct.
- (4) The student is expelled, withdraws, or transfers to another institution.
- (5) Any other case where the university determines termination is necessary.

4. Application Procedure

Submit the following documents to: Saga Campus—Diversity Center; Kanzaki Campus—Student Support Division.

(1) Application form (online submission)

*Refer to the International Exchange Center website for the URL.

(2) Income verification documents for all household members (copies allowed, must be clear)

*Previous year's documents

*If documents are issued only in languages other than Japanese or English, attach a translation in Japanese or English.

*If an adult household member has no income, submit documentation proving no income.

*If previous year's documents are unavailable, submit the most recent available ones.

(3) Academic transcript (copy allowed, must be clear)

*Previous year's documents

*If issued only in languages other than Japanese or English, attach translation in Japanese or English.

*If previous year's documents are unavailable, submit the most recent available ones.

(4) Proof of Japanese language proficiency (JLPT, NAT, etc.)

*Language ability may also be confirmed via interview.

5. Selection Method

Applicants will be ranked based on submitted documents, and scholarships with higher amounts will be assigned in order of ranking. If applicants have the same ranking, the one with lower household income will be prioritized.

6. Application Deadline

April 22, 2026 (Wednesday), noon
